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

**WESTERN ETHIOPIA TRIBES, SURMA & GAMBELA**

**Duration: 11 Days / 10 Nights**



### **Tour Highlights:**

- Explore the fascinating and strange cultures of the indigenous tribes of Western Ethiopia in a modern 4WD
- Visit the Shoa, the Wolega Oromo, the Nuer, the Anuak, the Menit, the Yem, the Dizi and the Oromo in their villages
- Explore the rich culture of the Surma people which are well known for their stick fighting events
- Get to know the traditional lifestyle, colorful dresses and strange rituals, amazing hair-styles, body-painting or scaring
- Enjoy indigenous forest, savannah as well as tea, coffee and spice plantations
- Shop the stalls of Merkato, the largest open-air market in Africa
- Traditional Ethiopian farewell dinner with “coffee ceremony” and traditional dances of different ethnic groups.

### **Travel date:**

Every day departure with a minimum of two participants.

<b>AAT-1121</b>	<b>WESTERN ETHIOPIA TRIBES, SURMA &amp; GAMBELA</b>	<b>11 Days / 10 Nights Surface</b>
<p><b>Day 1: Arrival in Addis Ababa</b> On arrival our representative will meet you at the airport and transfer you to your hote. An overview of the program will be given. The rest of the day visit historical sites in Addis Ababa, including the National Archeological Museum, where the 3.6 million year old remains of Lucy rest, whose skeletal remains were discovered in 1974. You will also visit the Ethnological Museum, the Holy Trinity Cathedral and Mount Entoto which rises up to an altitude of 3200meters and offers a panoramic view of the metropolis. Overnight 4-star hotel</p>		
<p><b>Day 2: Addis Abeba - Nekemt</b> After breakfast drive west to Nekemt through beautiful scenery and visit the Shoea and Wolega Oromo tribes and their villages.</p>		
<p><b>Day 3: Nekemt - Metu</b> After breakfast drive to Metu. After crossing the Didasa River we will stop at the town of Bedele for lunch. You drive through indigenous natural forests of Western Ethiopia and it is a good opportunity to see the life of the local people residing in the region.</p>		
<p><b>Day 4: Metu - Gambella</b> Continue driving to Gambella via Gore, through the indigenous natural forest of western Ethiopia. The area is famous for tea plantations. En route you will visit the Gumero tea field.</p>		
	<p><b>Day 5: In Gambella</b> The major two tribes living in Gambella town are the Nuer and Anuak people, who we visit during the day.</p>	
	<p><b>Day 6: Gambela - Mizan Teferi</b> Drive to Mizan Teferi through the Bebek coffee plantation - Ethiopia's largest and oldest coffee plantation. On the way visit the Menit, the Yem and the Dizi tribes.</p>	
<p><b>Day 7: Kibish</b> Continue driving further to the West from Bebek to Kibish. After crossing the Akobo River you experience an African savannah grass land. You stop at the little town of Dimma for lunch. Continue driving further west to Tulgit and then to Kibish, which are small towns of the Surma people. The rest of the day walk around your campsite to visit the Surma people. Overnight camping at Kibish</p>		
<p><b>Day 8: Around Kibish</b> In the morning, if there is any Donga (Stick fighting of the Surma people) you will attend it. Otherwise you walk around the old Kibish village and visit more Surma villages (14 km round trip). The Surma people are renowned for the strange custom followed by their women who, on reaching maturity, have their lower lips slit and circular clay discs inserted. The Surma men are well known for their stick fighting. Players are usually un-married men. The winner is carried away on a platform to a group of girls waiting at the side of the arena who decide among themselves which of them will</p>

Taking part in a stick fight is considered to be more important than winning it. Overnight camping at Kibish</p> <hr/> <p><b>Day 9: Kibish - Bebeka</b> Drive the same way back via Dima town to Bebeka town near the town of Mizan Teferi. Camping in Bebeka</p> <hr/> <p><b>Day 10: Bebeka - Jimma</b> Drive 240 km from Mizan Teferi to Jimma, through dense, indigenous forest. The Kefecho, Yem and Bench tribes live in this area, which is famous for coffee, tea and spice growing.</p> <hr/> <p><b>Day 11: Jima – Addis Ababa</b> After breakfast drive back to Addis Ababa. En route visit one of the Oromo villages. In the evening we have a farewell dinner in an Ethiopian restaurant with dances from different ethnic groups.
